major urban centres has sent countless people into the streets
in spring 2022 some of them found their way to the yard beside
the anglican church in toronto s kensington market where maggie
helwig is the priest they pitched tents formed an encampment
and settled in known as an outspoken social justice activist
helwig has spent the last three years getting to know the
residents and fighting tooth and nail to allow them to stay
battling various authorities that want to clear the yard and

keep the results of the housing crisis out of sight and out of mind encampment tells the story of helwig s life long activism as preparation for her fight to keep her churchyard open to people needing a home more importantly it introduces us to the artist to jeff and to robin their lives their challenges their humanity it confronts our society s callousness in allowing so many to go unhoused and demands by bringing their stories to the fore that we begin to respond with compassion and grace

from los angeles to boston and chicago to miami us cities are struggling to address the twin crises of high housing costs and household instability debates over the appropriate course of action have been defined by two poles building more housing or enacting stronger tenant protections these options are often treated as mutually exclusive with support for one implying opposition to the other shane phillips believes that effectively tackling the housing crisis requires that cities support both tenant protections and housing abundance he offers readers more than 50 policy recommendations beginning with a set of principles and general recommendations that should apply to all housing policy the remaining recommendations are organized by what he calls the three s s of supply stability and subsidy phillips makes a moral and economic case for why each is essential and recommendations for making them work together there is no single solution to the housing crisis it will require a comprehensive approach backed by strong diverse coalitions the affordable city is an essential tool for professionals and advocates working to improve affordability and increase community resilience through local action

this volume highlights the socioeconomic concerns related to medical care for homeless patients and places them at the interface of common psychiatric and medical problems clinicians encounter written by experts in psychiatry and other medical specialties this volume is a concise yet comprehensive overview of the homeless crisis its costs and ultimately best practices for improved outcomes the text begins by examining the scope and epidemiology of the problem and discusses its costs it then examines the best practices for both physical and psychiatric care before concluding with a section on working with special populations that have unique concerns across the country including lgbtq women children veterans and aging adults as the first medical book on homelessness it is designed to cover a

broad range of concerns in a concise practical fashion for all clinicians working with homeless patients clinical management of the homeless patient is written by and for psychiatrists general internists geriatricians pediatricians addiction medicine physicians va physicians and all others who may encounter this crisis in their work

this book addresses the tragic suffering of the homeless when we can get to the root causes of homelessness identify them and address them this is helpful in assisting those who are unhoused by sharing the story of one extraordinary individual the author illustrates how many factors are involved in a person s past that are interrelated and which influence each other s outcomes and solutions involve psychiatrists psychologists social workers faith communities schools and the government officials who write policy decisions into law solutions seem elusive and estimates of the resources needed are staggering but with concerted efforts there is hope

david snow and leon anderson show us the wretched face of homelessness in late twentieth century america in countless cities across the nation through hundreds of hours of interviews participant observation and random tracking of homeless people through social service agencies in austin texas snow and anderson reveal who the homeless are how they live and

why they have ended up on the streets debunking current stereotypes of the homeless down on their luck sketches a portrait of men and women who are highly adaptive resourceful and pragmatic their survival is a tale of human resilience and determination not one of frailty and disability

there have always been homeless people in the united states but their plight has only recently stirred widespread public reaction and concern part of this new recognition stems from the problem s prevalence the number of homeless individuals while hard to pin down exactly is rising in light of this congress asked the institute of medicine to find out whether existing health care programs were ignoring the homeless or delivering care to them inefficiently this book is the report prepared by a committee of experts who examined these problems through visits to city slums and impoverished rural areas and through an analysis of papers written by leading scholars in the field

homelessness is a tough topic to think about but it s essential we do not turn a blind eye to a plight that can impact anyone at any stage in life give your readers the right kind of material that empowers them with a desire to learn about the homeless editor louise i gerdes has compiled several primary source essays that examine two contrary sides to each issue considered across four chapters readers will evaluate whether homelessness is a serious problem that factors cause it what housing policies will benefit the homeless and what policies will best reduce homelessness

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
